I am now 91 years old, and am a retired Professor of Physics (emeritus), Illinois Institute of Technology (IIT), Chicago, IL, USA.

In 1988, driving northbound on six lanes (at this location) from IIT to home in Northbrook, IL, in clear sunlight, I saw one traffic lane ahead overlap into the lanes on the right (northbound Kennedy). Which lane should I be in? I shut one eye, which instantly gave me correct visual info (but no depth of vision). Long-story-short, I was able to find the way home with the aid of the navigator in the car (new way home). Scary-exciting.

Saw my (then) ophthalmologist next day. He checked eyesight and I went to my optometrist who made up glasses with prismatic correction which corrected the overlapping lanes problem. Now I could safely drive. –

Today (now retired), Mestinon (pyridostigmine) helps to maintain the semblance of a "new normal." Robinul (glycopyrrolate) mitigates the constipating effects of Mestinon. Currently (2017) trying physical therapy to help. Important to maintain muscles. I hope this is useful to someone.
